DIGITAL LEARNING EXPECTATIONS FOR PARENTS



Ensuring the success of Remote Learning takes a partnership of students, teachers, and parents. During this transition it is not the expectation that parents will be homeschooling their children. However, because we are not physically in the classroom, we are asking that families support teachers and their child's learning with the following:

Establish routines and expectations for students:

It is important to develop good, productive habits from the start to ensure success and good attendance.

- Make sure students follow their school and class schedule daily.
- Make sure students are waking up at the same time and getting ready for school.
- Check in frequently with students to make sure they're on time and connected.
- Ensure all work is completed.

Create an appropriate workspace:

Your child(ren) will achieve their best work in a structured, quiet, and distraction-free space dedicated that promotes productive learning. Ideally this will be a different area than where they normally play games or watch television.

- If students are in a shared space, ensure they have headphones to minimize distractions
- Make sure students are out of bed and at a seated area, preferably with a surface to place their Chromebook.
- Make sure students are dressed appropriately daily
- After your child logs in for class, please allow them the space to work and interact with the teacher throughout the day. Please allow the teacher to address any discipline issues. If the teacher would like to communicate regarding behavior, they will set a meeting with you.

Stay in touch:

Maintaining regular, open communication between your child, their teacher, and yourself to make sure expectations are clear and understood by everyone. You'll also need to receive up-to-date information regarding your child's school and their work.

- Teachers will be using Remind 101, email, and Skyward to communicate, please check these platforms daily for updates from your child's school and the district.
- If you need additional support at home, contact the school to communicate needs and concerns.

Make sure students have the tools for learning:

It is important that students are equipped with the materials they need to participate and learn effectively daily.

- Provide materials such as paper, pencils, note-taking apps, planners, etc.
- Make sure students have reliable WIFI connection and charged devices
