EVERMAN ISD BOND ELECTION INFORMATION

CITIZENS OF EVERMAN:

The Board of Trustees of the Everman Independent School District called for a bond election to be held on November 5, 2019, allowing voters to decide on facility improvements for the District.

This brochure is intended to provide factual information and answer general questions regarding the bond election so that voters can make an informed decision on Election Day.

The Board called for the election in the amount of \$40,000,000. The facility improvement projects included in the bond program are listed on the next page of this brochure.

HOW WILL THE BALLOT READ?

FOR or AGAINST

"The issuance of \$40,000,000 of Bonds by Everman Independent School District for the acquisition, construction and equipment of school buildings. Taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds will be imposed."

WHAT IS THE EXPECTED TAX IMPACT?

There will be no tax rate increase as a result of this bond proposal. The school district tax rate will remain the same.

WHAT IS THE IMPACT FOR SENIOR CITIZENS?

Taxes cannot go above the tax ceiling for taxpayers who are 65 years and older who have filed the Over 65 homestead exemption.

WHAT ABOUT STATE FUNDING?

Everman ISD is a state-funded school district. State funding is determined by a district's wealth per student. Because the District falls below the state's wealth equalization level per student, the state helps the District pay for its annual voted bond debt service. The state currently pays for approximately 25 percent of the outstanding voted bond debt service payments of the District. Given current state funding formulas and appropriate tax effort, the District anticipates the state will pay for approximately 25 percent of the new debt service if the bond program is approved by the voters and the bonds are issued.
